What we do at Cass

- <u>Food</u> Cass serves 700,000 meals each year to those that live with us and those off the street.
- <u>Housing</u> We house 300 people each night in our PSH programs, in our Emergency Family Shelter, our seasonal Warming Center and through the Wayne County Rotating Shelter.
- <u>Health Care</u> Cass hosts two free health clinics and operates a day program for adults with developmental disabilities.
- Cass's Green Industries provides green jobs for some of our residents and consumers.
- We are developing a community of <u>Tiny Homes</u> on our main campus.

Local Involvement

It is crucial to remember that travel to a faraway mission site is not the beginning and end of your mission! It is one portion of your congregation's expression of Christian love and service to the world. When at home, engage in activities that relate to the work at Cass Community Social Services.

- Research Tiny Houses and explore your community for places where tiny houses might serve a need. Contact local officials to encourage them to explore the idea of tiny houses.
- What resources are available locally for document destruction? Is this a project your local church might consider doing as a service to the community?
- Serve at a local food pantry or soup kitchen.
- Help out at a Free Store that provides clothing and household items for people in need.
- Is there a list of locations and times for community meals served in your area? If not, create this resource to share with other churches and local agencies.

Donations

Financial donations are always needed and appreciated. Have your team brainstorm on how to raise funds for the mission site even if you can't travel right now. Here are some ideas:

- If your team has already paid a deposit, consider giving it to them as a donation.
- Tell your congregation about what Cass is doing differently because of Covid-19, then ask for donations.
- Have a special event.
- Ask team members or church members to pledge a certain amount of money each month. A
 consistent stream of money each month can be very beneficial.
